


#### Income inequality (20:20 ratio)







### Single parenthood is not related to child wellbeing in rich countries







### Mental illness is more common in more unequal societies




#### Working hours are longer in more unequal countries



Earnings inequality: ratio of rich to middle (90<sup>th</sup>:50<sup>th</sup> percentile)






#### What kind of stress most reliably raises cortisol levels?



The effect of caste identity on children's performance






### Social mobility is lower in more unequal countries






### Inequality in child cognitive development
